On a more practical note, I have done a little research and found that it is safe to wash and re-use the (blue disposable) surgical masks up to 10 times:

- A disposable blue surgical mask can be worn more than once if it is washed in hot water each time it is worn.
- Washing in hot water and then drying will kill any virus particles they have collected during use.
- Putting them through the washing machine with soap powder is the harshest way of washing them; hand washing just in water is fine.
- Keep some with you all the time in case you need to use them.
