Today we had a Coronation Parade to mark the upcoming Coronation of King Charles which is a momentous occasion and part of our history. The following tamariki were awarded prizes:

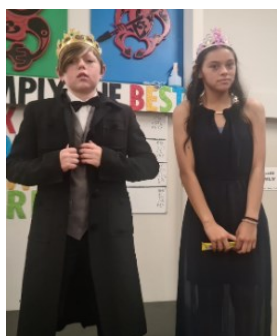

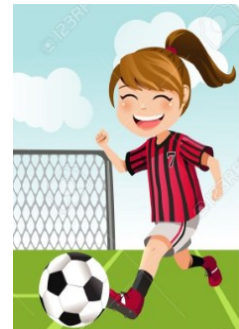
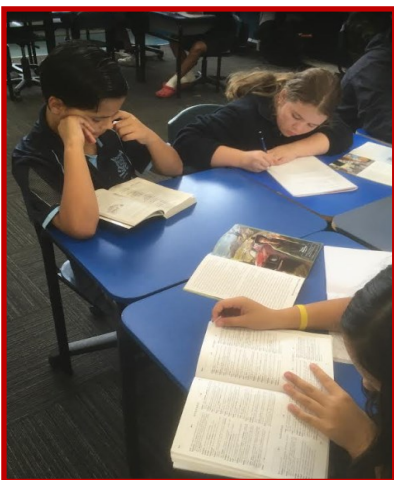
Matariki are working hard on their Reading, Writing and Maths while developing skills and knowledge on how to care for the environment.

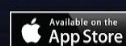
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
