
Mr Gurnick has resigned from his position at Miller Avenue School for personal reasons and to pursue other opportunities, we wish him well in his endeavours.

The government's budget announcements for public transport are now in place, so from 1 July 2023 there is now free public transport for children under 13 and half price for youth under 25, as part of the new Community Connect scheme.
