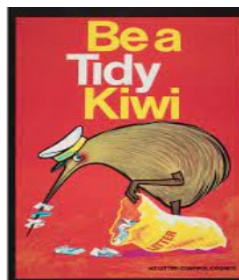
Lexus-Rose - for using word cards to write her story about a dragon.

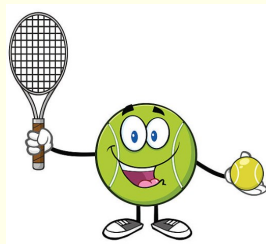
Waitā Wow (Rm 9)
